FAIR students...

- don't blame others carelessly.

Being Fair-Minded means accepting that other people have rights and privileges just like you do. It also means realizing that other people have different opinions about things. It is important to consider the other person—their rights, feelings, and opinions—in order to be fair.

Parents, please reinforce this PILLAR at home. Talk to your child about the importance of being fair with people. Make sure he/she knows that it is important to you and that being a fair person leads to good friendships and positive interpersonal relationships. Remember that you are a powerful role model for your child. If you treat people fairly, that is what your child will learn from you. It is our hope that this interaction with you and your child on this important character trait will increase your understanding of each other and help tie in our teachings at school with what you do every day of your child’s life. ☺
